BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN
 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs offers business, death, education, employment, financial, health, housing, legal advocacy and assistance, memorial, recreation, state government services, tax, and territory government services benefits to all United States military veterans; and

WHEREAS, Guam, which according to the 2010 Island Area Census conducted
by the U.S. Census Bureau has the highest percentage of veterans at 7.9 percent among
the U.S. territories, should have access to the benefits offered by the U.S. Department
of Veteran Affairs; and

WHEREAS, Guam veterans in the past and present have vocalized their concern over the inadequate care they have received from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, stating experiences such as medical claims never being processed, the island

having no specialized treatment facilities, and under-staffing at VA Guam Community-1 Based Outpatient Clinic, the island's only veteran outpatient care site; and 2

WHEREAS, to resolve benefit disparities, Honorable Delegate Gregorio Kilili 3 Camacho Sablan introduced to the House of Representatives H.R. 3730 with ten co-4 sponsors, which includes Guam's Honorable Delegate Michael F. Q. San Nicholas; and 5

WHEREAS, the purpose of H.R. 3730 is to establish in the Department of 6 Veterans Affairs an Advisory Committee on United States Outlying Areas and Freely 7 8 Associated States; and

WHEREAS, the Advisory Committee will be comprised of 15 voting members 9 appointed to represent covered veterans in eight remote areas of the world, one of them 10 being Guam; and 11

WHEREAS, the duty of Guam's Advisory Committee member representative 12 will include: 13

"(1) To advise the Secretary on matters relating to covered veterans, including 14 how the Secretary can improve the programs and services of the Department to better 15 16 serve such veterans.

"(2) To identify for the Secretary evolving issues of relevance to covered 17 18 veterans.

"(3) To propose clarifications, recommendations, and solutions to address issues 19 20 raised by covered veterans.

"(4) To provide a forum for covered veterans, veterans service organizations 21 serving covered veterans, and the Department to discuss issues and proposals for 22 changes to regulations, policies, and procedures of the Department. 23

"(5) To identify priorities for and provide advice to the Secretary on appropriate strategies for consultation with veterans service organizations serving covered veterans. 25

"(6) To encourage the secretary to work with other departments and agencies of 26 the Federal Government and Congress to ensure covered veterans are provided the full 27 benefits of their status as covered veterans. 28

"(7) To highlight contributions of covered veterans in the Armed Forces.

"(8) To conduct other duties as determined appropriate by the Secretary."; now
