AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 13.2 TO CHAPTER 1 OF DIVISION 1, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE GUAM WORLD RECONCILIATION ACT OF WAR II 2021 COMPENSATE **CLAIMS OF** THE **GREATEST** GENERATION OF GUAM FOR THE ATROCITIES SUFFERED WORLD DURING THE WAR П OCCUPATION OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. A new Section 13.2 is hereby *added* to Chapter 1 of Division 1,
- 3 Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

4 § 13.201 THE GUAM WORLD WAR II RECONCILIATION ACT OF 2021

Legislative Findings and Intent. On December 8, 1947, the Imperial
Japanese military invaded and occupied Guam for nearly three (3) years. During
these years, approximately twenty thousand (20,000) people suffered and were
subjected to death, rape, severe personal injury, personal injury, forced labor,
forced march, or internment. The United States Congress passed the Guam
Meritorious Claims Act on November 15, 1945 and was signed by President Harry
S. Truman as Public Law 79-224. This Act authorized the Secretary of the Navy

to grant immediate relief to the resident of Guam by adjudicating and settling claims for property damage, death, or personal injury.

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In 1947, Dr. Ernest M. Hopkins chaired a committee appointed to evaluate the U.S. Navy's execution of the Guam Meritorious Claims Act. The "Hopkins Report" generated by the committee determined that the implementation of the Guam Meritorious Claims Act was not sufficient and payments for claims were slow. The Hopkins Report recommended to Congress that changes were necessary; however, Congress failed to adopt any recommendations in future war claims legislation passed by it.

On December 23, 2016, nearly seventy-two (72) years after the passage of the Guam Meritorious Claims Act, the Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act was signed into law as U.S. Public Law 144-328. On June 20, 2017, the Commission's Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act Claims Program began. The Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act authorizes the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission to accept and adjudicate claims. Section 1705(B) of Public Law 144-328 gives the authority of the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission to publish a notice of the deadline for filing a claim in the Federal Register, newspaper, radio and television media in Guam. Pursuant to Section 1705(B) of Public Law 144-328, following the implementation of the Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act Claims Program, claimants were given one (1) year to file. The deadline to file a claim was on June 20, 2018. Since the June 20, 2018 deadline, over seven hundred remaining survivors of Guam's wartime occupation and their descendants have signed a petition urging Congress to amend the Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act to remove the deadline to file their claim.

While under the National Defense Authorization Act of 2017, the Guam World War II Claims Fund, also known as "Claims Fund", was established as a special fund by the Secretary of the Treasury for the payments of claims. Deposits collected under Section 30 over the 2014 threshold are to be made into the Claims Fund with deductions for administrative expenses.

While the Government of Guam has demonstrated through the Passage of P.L. 35-61 its intent and desire to pay out World War II claims as expeditiously as possible, Section 1705(B) of Public Law 144-328 prohibits members of the Greatest Generation who have not filed within the one-year filing period to file claims. It is the intent of the Guam World War II Reconciliation Act of 2021 to make right by these individuals as *I Liheslaturan* finds that it is a moral obligation to do right by our *Manamko*.

While *I Liheslaturan* finds that it is the duty of the United States Congress to correct this technical flaw, Guam's Delegate to Congress has urged *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to act independently as *I Liheslaturan* can ensure that its moral obligation to our *Manamko*' is fulfilled in a timely manner.

§ 13.202. Implementation of the Guam World War II Reconciliation Act of 2021.

Notwithstanding any provision of law, within thirty (30) days of the enactment of the Guam World War II Reconciliation Act of 2021, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan shall* submit to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* an implementable plan for the payment of War Claims under Public Law 144-328 to claimants whom under no fault of their own, failed to meet the one (1) year filing deadline under Section 1705(B) of Public Law 144-328. Upon the submission of *I Maga'hågan Guåhan's* implementation plan, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan may* adopt, reject, or amend

1	the plan by Resolution passed by a majority of I Liheslaturan Guåhan. If after 30
2	calendar days, I Liheslaturan Guåhan fails to act on the plan as submitted, the plan
3	shall be deemed adopted.

§ 13.203. Authorization to Deposit funds into the Guam War Claims Fund.

- (a) The Guam War Claims fund, established by P.L. 35-61, was established to expedite the payments of adjudicated claims. As prescribed under Subsection (e) of Article 13.1 of Chapter 1, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, monies reimbursed by the United States Department of Treasury for the implementation of Public Law 35-61 *shall* remain in said fund and is authorized to be expended for the payment of War Claims under Public Law 144-328 to claimants whom under no fault of their own, missed the one-year filing deadline under Section 1705(B) of Public Law 144-328.
- (b) Should such funds not suffice for the implementation of the Guam World War II Reconciliation Act of 2021, notwithstanding any other provision of law, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* is authorized to transfer such sums as may be available to her for the purposes outlined in Section § 13.202 of this Act.

Section 13.204. Effective Date. This act shall be effective immediately upon enactment and shall not expire.
